## The Story of the Poppy

The poppy flower only grows in the absence of other flowers and only in ground that has been churned. In perhaps the best known poem of World War I, when Dr. John McCrae observed poppies growing between the crosses on the soldiers' graves, it inspired him to write the poem *In Flanders Fields*. The poppy has since become known as “The Flower of Remembrance” and is worn in memory of our veterans.

## TOWN OF CORONATION

### CURB RAMPS:

With winter coming we ask that residents remove all curb ramps as the Town will not be responsible for loss or damage to them from snow removal.

### MOBILE TRAILER OWNERS:

Winter is coming so please insure that your heat tapes are working. The Town will not be responsible for water usage (loss) because of frozen water pipes bursting due to heat tape failure. In such cases the owner will be responsible for the cost to replace water meters and for the loss of water.

### DECEMBER 31<sup>ST</sup> TAX PENALTY DATE:

Unpaid Tax Accounts as of December 31, 2018 will be assessed a 10% penalty on the full balance outstanding. If you haven't paid your 2018 taxes already, please ensure that they are paid in full prior to December 31<sup>st</sup> to avoid further penalties.

### UNPAID UTILITY ACCOUNTS:

All Utility Accounts with past due balances on December 31, 2018 will be transferred to the tax roll of the property owner. Please ensure that your Utility Accounts are paid in full prior to December 31<sup>st</sup>.

## LAWS FOR CONSUMPTION OF CANNABIS WITHIN THE TOWN OF CORONATION WILL ALIGN WITH PROVINCIAL LEGISLATION AS FOLLOWS:

Individuals over the age of 18 will be allowed to consume cannabis in their homes and in some public spaces where smoking tobacco is allowed, but it is banned in vehicles.

To protect children and limit second-hand exposure, public smoking or vaping of cannabis will be prohibited in the same places tobacco is restricted, plus:

- on any hospital property, school property or child care facility property
- in or within a prescribed distance from:
  - a playground
  - a sports or playing field
  - a skateboard or bicycle park
  - a zoo
  - an outdoor theatre
  - an outdoor pool or splash pad
- in any motor vehicle except, those being used as temporary residences, such as parked RVs



There will also be no consumption of cannabis at any cannabis retail outlets.

### Growing Cannabis:

Under federal legislation, adults will be able to grow up to 4 plants per household from seeds bought from licensed cannabis retailers.

Renters, condo-dwellers and those who live in multi-family dwellings may not be allowed to grow cannabis in their homes based on rules in rental agreements or condominium bylaws.

### Propane Tanks

All sites can be used to recycle propane tanks. We take all sizes. The propane tank must be empty of any product and the valve must be in the opened position. Small camping tanks are also accepted. The Attendant will check the tank and let you know where it is to be placed.

### Railway Right of Way

There are still people using the old railway right of way for recreation purposes. The right of way is a utility corridor. The right of way contains important and valuable infrastructure that must be protected from any damage. We ask people to not use the right of way for recreational purposes.

### Site Safety

It is very important that when you are using any of the transfer stations to make sure that you follow the speed limits as posted and that you always use caution when placing your recyclables or garbage in bins or designated locations. Watch for other traffic and people on site. Please stay on the designated roadways when not dropping off materials and do not cut across green spaces.
