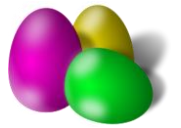

CORONATION FIRE DEPARTMENT NEWS

Coronation Fire Department had a quiet March with the department taking the opportunity to get some training sessions in and attend various fire courses that were available. It is nice to see some spring like temperatures and the snow starting to disappear!

The official start to Alberta's wildfire season was March 1st. Here are a few handy tips to help reduce the risk and damage caused by wildfires

- Keep roofs, gutters, porches and decks clean and free from dead vegetation i.e. sticks, leaves etc.
- Where possible keep flammable materials and fuel sources i.e. Wood piles, propane tanks, gas tanks etc. at least 30 feet away from buildings and structures
- Dispose of rubbish, debris, lawn clippings etc. quickly to reduce fuel sources.
- If you have a fire pit it must meet the requirements of the town bylaws:
 1. Have a minimum of 3m clearance from all flammable materials, structures, and boundaries
 2. The pit must be made of a non-flammable, suitable material not exceeding 1m in diameter
 3. Must have a mesh screen top to reduce the risk of sparks escaping
 4. It's also wise to have a water source ready and available in case something should go wrong.

Household Hazardous Waste Roundup

The Household Hazardous Waste Roundup is scheduled for Saturday, May 25th, 2019. The host community this year is the Town of Coronation at the Fire Hall. There also will be satellite pickups at Halkirk and Castor. Watch for further details in the coming weeks.

Propane Tanks

All three transfer stations have areas identified for the placement of propane tanks for recycling. All tanks must be empty of any product prior to bringing them to the sites. In the last few weeks propane tanks have been found in metal piles and demolition piles. This must stop before someone gets seriously injured. When pushing piles, it would be quite easy to puncture a tank creating a hazardous situation resulting in injury. There is no reason why tanks of any size should be anywhere, but in the designated area. Please be careful with propane tanks before someone does get hurt

Tarp Your Loads

The Transfer Stations will be getting quite busy as we start to clean up from winter. Please remember to tarp and tie down your loads so nothing blows out of the vehicle or trailer.

Sort Your Loads

If you sort your loads prior to coming to the transfer stations it makes the work a lot easier to unload your materials in their proper place. It also helps to stop the urge to unload materials in the wrong place. If you are unsure of where materials are to be placed, ask the Attendant on site for assistance.
